1-WILLOW/SPRUCE, 2-HEMLOCK/LOCUST, 3-PINE/POPLAR, 4-OAK/MAPLE

Each of these four lodges sleeps 44 people in dormitory fashion in single beds. For information about male/female ratios contact the Site Director. All of the lodges are seasonal and have no heat. Lodges are rented in pairs, each pair having a total of 88 beds. All four lodges will provide 176 beds.

ELM LODGE sleeps 29 people with three separate rooms in bunk beds. Various male/female ratios are possible. Please contact the Site Director for additional information.

The use of the following facilities is included during your stay in any of the above lodges: refrigeration and ice, the indoor chapel (if available), the outdoor chapel, the recreation hall, playground equipment, and the campfire circle. Meals can be provided by camp staff or by self. Cold meal prep is included; however, a kitchen use fee of \$80 per meal will apply with the use of any cooking appliances.

THE RETREAT CABIN

The retreat cabin accommodates a maximum of eight persons. The cabin includes a living room, ¾ bath, kitchenette and two bedrooms. The kitchenette is equipped with a refrigerator and microwave; no stove is available. Sleeping accommodations include two bunk beds per room. The occupants do all cooking.

INDOOR CHAPEL (weddings)

The indoor chapel is seasonal only and accommodates a maximum of 200 people. The interior is a rustic, exposed beam décor with knotty pine wane coating. An electric organ is available.

RECREATION HALL

The recreation hall accommodates 125 people. There is a raised stage and various rectangular tables available. The building has a studio piano and contains a pull down screen and a TV, DVD/VCR player, digital projector, over head projector and a PA system.

BEECH-SMALL MEETINGS

Beech is a small meeting room that can seat 25 people comfortable. Padded chairs and rectangle tables are provided. Restrooms and parking area are near this facility.

NOTE: The use of the Chapel and all other facilities is to be in compliance with the Social Principles of the United Methodist Church.

MEALS

Groups have a choice of either having their meals prepared by the food service staff, or providing their own food and preparing their own meals. Meals are served buffet style. Dining may be with other groups who have reserved other facilities.

PET POLICY

Bringing pets on camp property is discouraged but individual circumstances may be negotiated with Site Director prior to arrival. No pets are permitted in any of the buildings.
